**Explosive Destruction System Featured Exhibit**

**During Pueblo Weisbrod Aircraft Museum Free Day Saturday, Sept. 6**

PUEBLO CHEMICAL DEPOT, Colo. -- 6 Sept. 2014. The [Pueblo Weisbrod Aircraft Museum](#) is offering free admission to visitors to view an actual [Explosive Destruction System](#), or EDS, owned and operated by the U.S. Army. The system will be used at the Pueblo Chemical Depot (PCD) to safely start chemical agent demilitarization operations this fall. It will destroy problematic chemical munitions that will not be able to go through the [Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant](#), or PCAPP, which is set to begin its own operations in 2015.

Also featured will be interactive displays, hands-on equipment, simulated munitions and presentations geared to all ages. Concessions will be available. Children must be accompanied by an adult.
