


A Partnership for Safe Chemical Weapons Destruction

Walton Levi

Deputy Site Project Manager Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant

Mr. Walton Levi is the deputy site project manager for the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant (PCAPP) in Colorado. Selected for this role in October 2008, Mr. Levi serves as a technical expert, advisor, and supervisor on the staff of the site project manager with overall responsibility for functional areas relative to management of the pilot plant's field office. This includes oversight of Bechtel Pueblo, the systems contractor for the design, construction, systemization, pilot testing, operation and closing of the plant.

A native of Colorado Springs, Colo., Mr. Levi attended Colorado State University, Fort Collins, receiving a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering in 1987. That same year, Mr. Levi began his federal career as a chemical engineer for the Chemical Agent Munitions Destruction System (CAMDS), which at the time was part of Tooele Army Depot (TEAD) in Utah, where he served as a project engineer for the incineration systems and special projects.

In 1990, upon expansion of the environmental mission and office at TEAD, Mr. Levi transferred to the Risk Management Directorate as an environmental engineer. As a project manager, his primary responsibility was developing, implementing and managing the water quality programs and hazardous waste minimization program for the Tooele Army Depot Complex. Additionally, he managed the restoration/remediation program for the former Tooele Army Depot South Area (now called Deseret Chemical Depot, Utah). While at TEAD, Mr. Levi also served as the environmental liaison to the Corps of Engineers/Chemical Demilitarization Field Office during the initial construction phase of the Tooele Chemical Agent Disposal Facility.

Between July 1997 and October 2008, Mr. Levi served as the director of Risk Management, administering and overseeing the Environmental, Safety, Surveillance, Operations Center, Fire Department and Medical programs for Deseret Chemical Depot. From November 2010 to June 2011, he served as PCAPP's acting site project manager. During this period, he hosted a number of events and distinguished visitors from ambassadors representing nations aligned with the Organisation for the Prohibition for Chemical Weapons to committees from the National Research Council.

Mr. Levi has been the recipient of the Commander's Medal on seven occasions.
