Walton Levi named Acting Site Project Manager as search for permanent replacement continues

PUEBLO CHEMICAL DEPOT, Colo. -- In a meeting with federal employees at the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant (PCAPP) Tuesday, Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives (ACWA) Deputy Program Manager Joe Novad announced that Walton Levi will assume responsibilities as Acting Site Project Manager beginning November 1.

Novad also said that a search for a permanent replacement for the position of site project manager continues, with announcements advertising the vacancy due to come out in the near future.

Levi, who currently serves as PCAPP's deputy site project manager, will take over duties from Scott Susman who will return to his post as systems engineer for the ACWA Systems Engineering and Operations Team at the ACWA Program Office in Aberdeen, Md.

A native of Colorado Springs, Colo., Levi attended Colorado State University, Fort Collins, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Engineering in 1987. That same year, he began his federal career with the Chemical Agent Munitions Destruction System, at the time part of Tooele Army Depot in Utah, where he served as a project engineer for the incineration systems and special projects. He continued service at sites in Utah with the Army's chemical demilitarization program until October 2008, when he assumed his current position at PCAPP.

Novad praised Susman for his work over the past four months at PCAPP, noting that construction at the site has continued to move forward under his leadership.
