

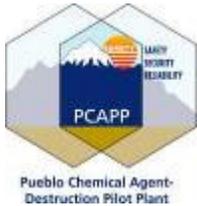

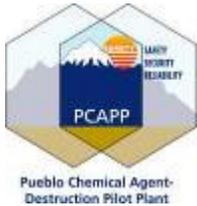

Project Background

A Partnership for Safe Chemical Weapons Destruction

- **The Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant (PCAPP) will safely destroy 2,611 tons of mustard agent in mortar and artillery projectiles stored at the U.S. Army Pueblo Chemical Depot in Pueblo, Colorado.**
- **The technology selected by the Department of Defense to destroy the Pueblo chemical weapons stockpile is neutralization followed by biotreatment.**
- **The Program Manager, Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives (ACWA), headquartered at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland is responsible for managing all aspects of the safe and environmentally sound destruction of the chemical weapons stockpiles in both Colorado and Kentucky.**
- **The Bechtel Pueblo Team, a partnership of Bechtel National, Inc.; Washington Demilitarization Company; Parsons; and Battelle Memorial Institute, is the systems contractor selected to design, build, systemize, pilot test, operate and close the PCAPP.**



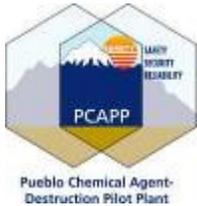
Current Project Staffing

A Partnership for Safe Chemical Weapons Destruction

- **Bechtel Pueblo Team currently employs 249 personnel located as follows:**
 - Pueblo: 89 (19 local hires)
 - San Francisco: 49
 - Frederick, MD: 111
- **Subcontractor construction workers on site: 30 – 60 each day**
- **As of 31 December 2006, PCAPP employees have worked more than 2.3 million job hours without a lost-time injury**



Safety Manager Terry Wells checks equipment that will be used to stretch fabric over Access Control Point structures.



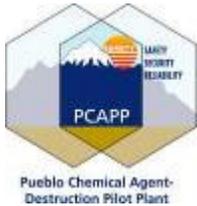
Local hires

4. **Jackie Gold (left) and Mary Griego operate the project document control center.**

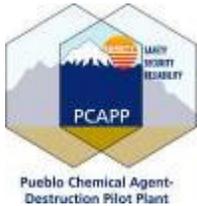


Acquisitions

A Partnership for Safe Chemical Weapons Destruction

As of 31 December 2006:

- **Total Awards - \$ 47.3 Million**
 - **\$19.9 Million to businesses in Pueblo County**
 - **\$11.9 Million to Colorado businesses (outside Pueblo County)**
 - **\$15.5 Million to businesses outside Colorado**
- **67% of Awards Went to Local/Regional Firms**
 - **42% Local Spend (Pueblo County)**
 - **25% Regional Spend (in Colorado, outside Pueblo County)**

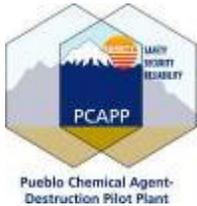

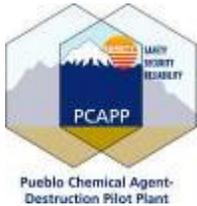



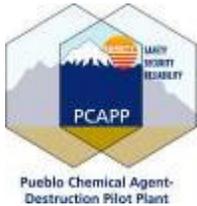




Site Clearing and Grading

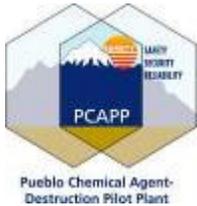


Stormwater Control

Bechtel construction engineer Ron Girard inspects culverts that will be part of the stormwater control system

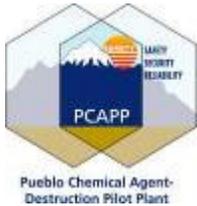


Multipurpose Building

Survey stakes mark outline of the Multipurpose Building, which will be used for warehousing and maintenance activities

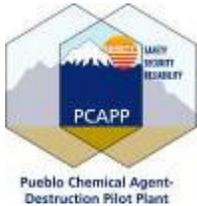
