## About the Project

Over the next several years, a facility called the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant (PCAPP) will be built at the U.S. Army Pueblo Chemical Depot. This facility will safely destroy the stockpile of chemical weapons stored at the depot since the 1950s. ## Pueblo Chemical Stockpile Outreach Office

Established in 1997, the outreach office serves as the center of information for the chemical weapons destruction program in Pueblo. The role of the office is to exchange information between the community and the decision-makers involved in this important national project.

The Program Manager Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives is the Department of Defense agency responsible for destruction of the Pueblo chemical weapons stockpile.

Known as ACWA, the program has a long history of public involvement regarding chemical demilitarization, where opinions and input from the community are encouraged. Together with the Pueblo Chemical Depot and the Bechtel Pueblo Team, project leaders recognize the importance of sharing information and involving the community in the decision-making process.

## Public Outreach Partners

Teaming partners maximize public outreach efforts in Pueblo County communities. Each partner has expertise in various aspects of the chemical weapons destruction project.

### U.S. Army Pueblo Chemical Depot Public Affairs - (719) 549-4135

The mission of the depot is the safe and secure storage of its stockpile of mustard agent. This team answers questions about the depot and its history, including chemical weapons storage, environmental restoration and emergency plans.

### Bechtel Pueblo Team - (719) 546-0400

Bechtel Pueblo Team is the systems contractor that will design, build, test, operate and close the plant that will destroy the chemical weapons. ### Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment - 1-(888)-569-1831 ext. 3303

The Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division of the state health department has regulatory oversight of the PCAPP project. The state health department monitors everything from facility design and construction to plant emissions and approves permits needed to build and operate the facility.
