

# Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant (PCAPP) EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES AT PCAPP

Your involvement in the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant (PCAPP) project is important to us, and we're committed to keeping you informed and involved. In fact, the community and local workforce play a key role in helping to achieve the PCAPP mission. We want to keep you up to date with the latest information on construction-related employment opportunities because the project is committed to hiring as many local workers as possible. People with many different skills will be needed to successfully build and operate the pilot plant.

## Upcoming PCAPP Job Opportunities

With site preparation work complete, the PCAPP project is focusing on the construction of process buildings. The project has received approval from the state health department to proceed on limited construction for these buildings. This work began in early 2008, with the excavation of the foundation for the agent processing building. Additional approvals were granted later this year to allow limited construction of the enhanced reconfiguration building and the automated guided vehicle corridor.

As a result of this activity, the number of construction workers at PCAPP will increase to 220 by the end of 2008. Currently, the project employs more than 160 construction workers and more than 230 non-manual workers, such as administrative assistants, information systems technicians and design engineers. Although both the manual and non-manual workforce at PCAPP is expecting growth in the near future, the bulk of hiring during the next few months will be in the construction craft trades. Below is a partial list of union craft positions that will need to be filled and the approximate number of openings:

Carpenters - 4, pipefitters - 12, electricians - 10, ironworkers - 17, laborers - 14, operating engineers - 2, and teamsters - 1.

## PCAPP's Project Labor Agreement

Before construction began, a Project Labor Agreement, or PLA, was developed by Bechtel, PCAPP's systems contractor, and the Colorado Building and Construction

Trades Council (CBCTC). Local labor leaders worked with Bechtel to develop the details of the project labor agreement. One key part of the agreement was that PCAPP would only hire union craft workers. The project PLA also included a provision to encourage local non-union businesses to sign up and perform work. This relationship with local union leaders continues to be an integral part of the PCAPP project, with many of the workers being referred to the project by area union halls.
