ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – Bruce M. Huenefeld has been selected as the site project manager for the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant in Pueblo, Colo. Huenefeld will be the lead government manager overseeing the pilot plant's field office and the systems contract with the Bechtel Pueblo Team. He will report to the Program Manager, Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives (ACWA) headquartered here.

Huenefeld most recently served as a supervisory engineer at Rocky Mountain Arsenal, near Commerce City, Colo., where his duties involved oversight of hazardous waste treatment projects and contract management associated with environmental cleanup activities. Prior to his assignments at the arsenal, he worked at Aberdeen Proving Ground, where he gained experience in chemical demilitarization, including systemization and pollution abatement.

"Bruce is uniquely qualified to lead the ACWA team in Pueblo," said ACWA Deputy Program Manager Joseph Novad. "We're looking forward to adding his wide range of professional skills to the project."

Huenefeld, who currently resides in Arvada, Colo., holds a degree in chemical engineering from the University of Wyoming. He is expected to transition to the Pueblo team in June.
