Public comment period extended to April 30 on Pueblo Chemical Depot environmental assessment

Second public meeting now scheduled for April 27 in Pueblo

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – A public comment period associated with an environmental assessment that was originally scheduled to close on April 27, is being extended through April 30, 2010, to provide more time for community review. The environmental assessment, which concluded that no significant impacts would occur as a result of the construction and operation of explosive destruction technologies at the U.S. Army Pueblo Chemical Depot in Colorado, has been available for public comment since Feb. 27.

A second public meeting on the topic has been scheduled on April 27 from 4-6 p.m. at the Olde Towne Carriage House, 102 S. Victoria, in Pueblo.

The regularly scheduled Colorado Chemical Demilitarization Citizens' Advisory Commission (CAC) meeting will also provide an opportunity to discuss the assessment on April 28 at 6 p.m. at the McHarg Park Community Center, 405 2nd St. in Avondale, Colo. The governor-appointed CAC serves as a link between the community and the government by providing a regular forum to exchange information on chemical weapons destruction.
