LTC Scott D. Gould was born in Colorado. He received his commission through the Reserve Officer Training Corps as a Distinguished Military Graduate after graduating from the University of Colorado with a degree in Physics. He holds a Master's degree in Engineering Management from Missouri University of Science and Technology.

His military career began as the Assistant S-3 of Special Troops Battalion (BN), V Corps in Heidelberg, Germany. While in Germany, he served as the Executive Officer and then Commander of the 503d Chemical Detachment. He then served as the Brigade Chemical Officer of the 4th Infantry Division Artillery at Ft. Hood, Texas. While at Fort Hood, he served as the BN S1 for the 2nd Chemical BN before assuming command of the 44th Chemical Company, 2nd Chemical BN. He deployed the company to Iraq in 2003 for OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM. He then taught the Officer Basic Course and Captains Career Course as a Small Group Instructor before being assigned as the Chief of the Technical Training Department while assigned to the 84th Chemical BN at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. In 2007, he deployed to Qatar assigned to the Joint Security Office (FWD), Headquarters (FWD), U.S. Central Command as a Vulnerability Assessment Team CBRN Officer and Deputy in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM. At Fort Lewis, Washington, he served and deployed with I Corps to Iraq in 2009 in support of OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM as the J3 Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection Section Operations Officer and Deputy. He then served as the Operations Officer for the 110th Chemical BN (Technical Escort) and the Executive Officer for the 23rd Chemical BN. His next assignment was to the J5/8, Headquarters, U.S. European Command, Stuttgart, Germany. There he served as the CBRN Officer for the J5/8 Combating Weapons of Mass Destruction Branch and as the Executive Officer to the J5/8. His assignment prior to assuming command was as the Director of Instruction at the U.S. Army CBRN School at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri.

His awards and decorations include: the Bronze Star (two awards); the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (three awards); Joint Service Commendation Medal; Army Commendation Medal (three awards); Joint Service Achievement Medal (two awards); Army Achievement Medal (three awards); Iraq Campaign Medal (three Bronze Stars); Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal; Global War on Terrorism Service Medal; National Defense Service Medal with Star; Overseas Service Ribbon; and Basic Parachutist Wings.
