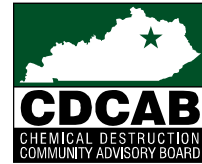

Dear Mr. Abaie,

We write now in regard to the preparations for the Closure phase of the BGCAPP project.

As always, we appreciate your consistent communication with the Kentucky CAC/CDCAB and look forward to continuing the positive relationship between us and ACWA under your leadership.

On 14 October members of the Process Working Group (PWG) were briefed on "Property Reuse and Closure Activities" associated with this phase and also toured the BGCAPP location.

This opportunity was reflective of the continued engagement with the CAC/CDCAB and the importance of transparency necessary to complete the mission.

As you are aware, the previously used process for our input into this phase of the project will continue as we move closer to Closure. This will include recommendations provided as additional information is discussed between ACWA and the CAC/CDCAB. It is understood that reuse of equipment, transfer of property and integration of any BGCAPP infrastructure to the BGAD primary mission will ultimately be left to the Government entities as identified in the relevant statutes.

With that in mind, we believe it's important for the local representatives to engage in the decision making process in order to ensure the best outcomes for the Depot and the community.

We look forward to continued interaction on this final phase of the ACWA program and stand ready to assist in any way towards a productive future post demilitarization.
