## Col. Lee G. Hudson

### Commander Blue Grass Army Depot

Col. Lee G. Hudson is a native of San Francisco, Calif. He was commissioned a second lieutenant of Infantry in 1990 following completion of a bachelor's degree from Auburn University. In 2000, he received an MBA with honors from Hawaii Pacific University. He holds a master's degree in National Security Strategy from the National War College, Fort McNair, Washington, D.C.

After completing the Infantry Officer Basic Course, Hudson served as a Rifle Platoon Leader in the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion 505<sup>th</sup> Parachute Infantry Regiment, 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, N.C. Later, following transition to the Ordnance Corps, he served in several company grade positions within the 782<sup>nd</sup> Main Support Battalion, DISCOM, 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division.

In 1995, Hudson was the S4, Army Forces, Joint Task Force-Bravo, Republic of Honduras. In 1996, he served as Director, Plans, Training, Mobilization and Security, and commanded the Camp Casey Headquarters Detachment, 19<sup>th</sup> TAACOM, Camp Casey, Republic of Korea.

In 1997, Hudson served as the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division (Light) Maintenance Officer, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. Thereafter, he served as the 325<sup>th</sup> Forward Support Battalion Operations Officer (S3) and commanded the 325<sup>th</sup> FSB's Maintenance Company. In 2000, he was assigned to the Special Operations Theater Support Element-Pacific (SOTSE-PAC), Fort Shafter, Hawaii, where he served as a PACOM Logistics Planner in support of SOF. In 2001, he was assigned to the National Capitol Region for a one-year fellowship with the Logistics Management Institute. Following that, he served as the Executive Officer to the G3, U.S. Army Materiel Command, Alexandria, Va.

Following CGSC at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., Hudson served from 2004 to 2008 in the U.S. Army Office of Military Support, Washington, D.C., where he served as the Director of Logistics, Battalion Support Operations Officer, Battalion Executive Officer and Brigade Executive Officer and deployed to OIF twice in support of Joint Task Force missions.

Hudson commanded the 1<sup>st</sup> Special Forces Group (Airborne) Support Battalion from 2008 to 2010 and commanded the Mission Support Element, U.S. Army Office of Military Support from 2010 to 2012, supporting SOF and counter-terrorism missions in Iraq, Afghanistan, the Philippines and North Africa.

Hudson's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Korea Defense Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, GWOT Service Medal and Master Parachutist, Ranger, Pathfinder and Air Assault Badges.
