What is the purpose of these permit modification requests?	The U.S. Army and its contractor, Bechtel National, Inc., operate the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant destroying mustard-containing chemical munitions stored at Pueblo Chemical Depot. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment issued the Research, Development, and Demonstration Permit on July 1, 2004.  The Army and Bechtel are now applying for the following Class 2 permit modification:  Modification #117, Hydrolysate Truck Loading Station:  This permit modification request is proposing to construct and operate a Hydrolysate Truck Loading Station. The Hydrolysate Truck Loading Station will be located adjacent to the 30-day Hydrolysate Storage Tanks secondary containment.  The proposed Hydrolysate Truck Loading Station will be used on an intermittent basis for shipments of hydrolysate to an offsite Treatment, Storage, and Disposal Facility (TSDF). PCAPP plans to continue treating hydrolysate at PCAPP concurrent with dispositioning hydrolysate offsite. Examples of the operating conditions under which the Hydrolysate Truck Loading Station will be used could include the following:  • Initial reduction of hydrolysate volume accumulated to provide additional tank capacity to sustain Pilot Testing activities  • Contingency needed to manage inventories in the 30-day storage tanks to allow for continued plant operations in the event that the on-site treatment process fails or lags behind the generation of hydrolysate from PCAPP agent destruction processes.  This Permit Modification Request requires revision to Part III, Storage and Treatment in Tanks and Miscellaneous Units; Part V, Storage and Treatment in Containers; Attachment D, Waste Analysis Plan; Attachment E, List of Drawings; Attachment J, Hazard Preparedness and Prevention Plan; and Attachment K, Inspection Plan.
When is the public meeting?	A public meeting to discuss this permit modification request will be held in Pueblo at the District Attorney's office, 701 Court Street (main 1st floor conference room), at 2:00 p.m. on March 29, 2017.
