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| <p><b>What is the purpose of these permit modification requests?</b></p>     | <p>The U.S. Army and its contractor, Bechtel National, Inc., operate the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant destroying mustard-containing chemical munitions stored at Pueblo Chemical Depot. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment issued the Research, Development, and Demonstration Permit on July 1, 2004.</p> <p>The Army and Bechtel are now applying for the following Class 2 permit modification:</p> <p><b>Modification #97, Agent Processing Building (APB) Container Storage Update:</b></p> <p>This permit modification request is being submitted to add storage of RCRA-regulated containers in the Munitions Washout System Room (APB-125), Off-gas Treatment Room (APB-116), Hydrolysate Hold Tank Room (APB-122), Glovebox Sampling Room (APB-129), and the Munitions Receiving Room (APB-114). Storage in these rooms will occur primarily in 55-gallon high-density polyethylene (HDPE) open head drum containers but various other containers may be used for storage.</p> <p>The requested storage is for seven 55-drum and two 4 ft. x 6 ft. bin containers in the Munitions Washout System room; eight 55-drum containers in Off-gas Treatment Room; nine 55-drum containers in the Hydrolysate Hold Tank Room; one 55-drum container in the Glovebox Sampling Room; and eighteen 55-drum containers in the Munitions Receiving Room. Smaller containers, for example five-gallon pails, will be considered equivalent to a 55-gallon drum and the storage of an 85 or 95-gallon drum will be considered to be equivalent to the storage of two 55-gallon drums.</p> <p>This Permit Modification Request requires revision of Part IV, Storage and Treatment in Containment Buildings; Attachment J, Hazard Preparedness and Prevention Plan; Attachment K, Inspection Plan; and Attachment L, Operations Plan.</p> |
