The application requests modification of the current Pueblo Chemical Depot Hazardous Waste Permit to construct and operate a total of three Static Detonation Chambers to treat and destroy chemical munitions, energetics and associated waste items. The Chambers include a controlled flame to combust and destroy contaminants of concern in emissions after each process and are therefore subject to the Standards for Hazardous Waste Incinerators under the Colorado Hazardous Waste Regulations (6 CCR 1007- 3, Part 264, Subpart O).

Pueblo Chemical Depot is owned by the Department of Defense (DOD) and operated by the Department of the Army. PCD was constructed in 1942 as the Pueblo Ordnance Depot. It was first used for the storage and supply of ammunition, and later its mission included ammunition renovation and demilitarization, and missile maintenance. The Depot's current missions are: historic environmental remediation activities, and safe and secure storage and the eventual demilitarization of chemical weapons.

Program Executive Office Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives (ACWA) is headquartered at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland. It is responsible for project management to destroy the Depot's chemical weapons stockpile. ACWA is responsible for oversight of the systems contract with Bechtel National, Inc.

The Division will send out another public notice when the draft permit decision is prepared and available for review and comment by the public.
