PUEBLO, Colo. – The cost-cutting design options being considered for the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant will be discussed in community information sessions planned for June 27 in Boone, June 28 in Avondale and June 29 in Pueblo.

Information available at each session will focus on the factors leading to the need for cost reduction, the implications of the design options on potential local jobs and construction start dates for the pilot plant.

Representatives of the Program Manager Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives (PMACWA), the Colorado Chemical Demilitarization Citizens' Advisory Commission (CAC) and other experts will be on hand to answer questions, and members of the public will have an opportunity to provide feedback on the design options.
