Government Site Project Manager Selected to Lead Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – Gary M. Anderson has been selected as site project manager for the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant, reporting to the Program Manager Assembled Chemical Weapons Alternatives headquartered here. Anderson will be the lead government engineer responsible for management of the pilot plant's field office and oversight of the systems contract with Bechtel Pueblo.

A native of Connecticut, Anderson's Army civilian career began in 1983. Most recently, he held the position of deputy site project manager at the Umatilla Chemical Agent Disposal Facility, located near Hermiston, Ore. He also held engineering positions at Johnston Atoll Chemical Agent Disposal System in the Pacific and at Rocky Mountain Arsenal, near Denver, Colo.

He holds a master's degree in Environmental Engineering from the Colorado School of Mines and a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Nebraska. Among his career awards are the Superior Civilian Service Award and two Commander's Awards for Civilian Service.

Anderson will join the Pueblo team on July 27.
